1. SOME MAIN INDICATORS FOR ANALYZING THE BASIC SITUATION OF HOUSEHOLDS THROUGH THE CENSUS DATA

For analyzing and assessing the basic situation of the household through census data it is necessary to use main indicators such as: household characteristics, number of household members, change in production structure, quality of labour, use of land, equipment, results of agricultural, forest and fishery production, improvement of material and spirit life.

2. SOME POINTS WORTH TO BE ATTENDED ON DATA COLLECTION FOR CALCULATING THE TRANSPORT PRICE INDEX IN THAI BINH PROVINCE

To implement the plan of data collection for calculating the transport price index – one of the indexes which are being concerned by various levels and branches and from the actual situation in Thai Binh province we find the following salient points:

- For passenger traffic, there was no water-transport in Thai Binh province
- For freight traffic there was no specialized transport in Thai Binh province. In particular among the transports by taxi, lambretta and Cong-nong vehicle we only have data for the Cong-nong transport. The situation of the along-river and -sea shore freight transports is also similar. In order to overcome the above-mentioned shortcomings it is necessary to:
- Allow provinces to choose the type of transport that are actually operating in their local areas to collect information
 - For transportation price we should use a stable price for the whole survey period.

3. THE RURAL, AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERY CENSUS IN NINH BINH PROVINCE Le Van Dung

In order to successfully implement the rural, agricultural and fishery census, the Ninh Binh Provincial Statistics Office had implemented well the following aspects of work:
